The 202nd Annual Communication

Due to attendance restrictions by the CDC and only 50% of capacity permitted, the in person Annual Communication was limited to Grand Lodge Officers, Permanent Members and one person per lodge. Certain parts of the Communication were streamed live on the Grand Lodge's YouTube channel.

At the appropriate hour, the Grand Marshal escorted the Grand Master and the suite of Grand Lodge officers to the stage for the ceremonial opening of the Grand Lodge.

The Grand Master and his Officers opened the 202nd Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Maine in Ample Form. The Anah Shrine Flag unit posted the colors.

The Grand Master had the Past Grand Masters escorted into the Lodge room by the Grand Marshal. Grand Master Nadeau introduced each Past Grand Master and led the Craft in giving them the Private Grand Honors.

Right Worshipful Neal Haines, Grand Chaplain invoked the presence and guidance of the Supreme Architect of the Universe during this Annual Communication.

Grand Master led the Brethren in the salute of our flag and the pledge of allegiance. The National Anthem was then played for both the in person and online audiences.

The Grand Secretary responded that there were no Special Communications or regrets.

Deputy Grand Master makes the following motions:

- 1. MWGM, I move that we dispense with the reading of the records of the last Annual Communication and that, as printed, they be confirmed. Motion was seconded. Vote was unanimous.
- 2. I move that the Grand Tyler be authorized to employ such assistants as necessary to aid him in the work of his office during this session of Grand Lodge. Motion was seconded. Motion carried.

The Deputy Grand Master assumed the Grand East and the Grand Master presented his Address.

Annual Address of the Grand Master

Grand Masters Address 202nd Annual Communication 2021

To the Past Grand Masters, Permanent members, Appendant Body Heads, our out of state guests who may be viewing this communication from afar, and Brethren all.

Good Morning. I cannot even begin to tell you how wonderful it is to be here in person with all of you today for our 202nd Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Maine. Just a few weeks ago, this communication was going to be completely virtual with only 50 of us in this beautiful space. It is my pleasure to report to you the fraternity's activities over the last 12 months and present a preview of what we expect to materialize over the ensuing year with a pandemic considered.

In our lifetime, Freemasonry has not before endured the hardships of the last 12 months. Much of our attention has been occupied by the Covid pandemic, which should be the catalyst that makes us all mindful of the things we take for granted every day. We have, over the last year, learned the unfortunate reality that nothing in life is certain. Our lives, both personal and Masonic, have been tested in ways that we have not experienced before. Like any new skill or "pandemic," there is a learning curve that we must go through. Our learning curve for the last 12 months consisted of the "start of the pandemic, the peak of the pandemic, and now the steady exit from the pandemic." At the start of this mess, we at the Grand Lodge were fielding calls at the rate of several per week and even several per day reporting exposures and positive tests and how best to navigate those incidents. With the minimal information available from the CDC on how to best handle each incident, we took what we knew and carefully and analytically assessed each exposure and determined what the proper course of action was for those incidents. There was no map, no past experiences to draw from to guide the Lodges.

At this point, I can say that the Brethren have well navigated the bell curve and are now more confident in handling COVID-19 incidents. We have suffered the loss of many of our dear Brethren to this unforgiving virus. Still, it could have been much worse if it weren't for all of our Brethren doing their due diligence to protect themselves, their families, their communities, and their brethren. While many do not believe that this pandemic will affect them, brethren just look at the losses in our Fraternity. We have one Lodge that lost 10% of their membership from Covid. For others, this pandemic scares the daylights out of them. Regardless of which end of the spectrum you are, your Brethren and I are grateful to you for following the edicts put forth for the protection of all of us. By airing on the side of caution, we have sent a most powerful message to our brethren. The message being, "I care about you, and regardless of how I feel, I will do all I can to protect you." For that, Brethren, I Thank you.

As you can see from the number of Brethren here today, we are slowly returning to a time where we will be able to resume our "normal" activities soon. Shortly after this communication, Brethren, you can expect a new Edict that will supersede all previous ones and contain some positive changes to the way we exemplify the Master Mason degree. We will still have local, state, and federal mandates to follow, but I believe that albite some unexpected significant surge of the pandemic, we are well on our way to more familiar times. I ask that you continue to be understanding of our Brethren who are hesitant to return. Be considerate and compassionate to their needs. Be sure that they know that you are ready to assist them in their times of need.

This pandemic has thwarted the ability of our jurisdiction to celebrate our 200th anniversary as a Grand Lodge. Last year, we had to cancel our trip to the George Washington Masonic National Memorial, building a float for the Bicentennial Maine State Parade, the 400 seats and corporate picnic area for Maine day at the Sea Dogs ballpark, the Oklahoma Native American Degree Team, and multiple other events planned throughout the jurisdiction such as Rededication of Lodges and other gatherings for celebration. Many lodges were unable to pursue the plans they had and not mention the regular and reoccurring events that generated money to support the lodge's finances and continue to assist their communities.

I am happy to announce that we have rescheduled our trip to DC to visit the George Washington Masonic National Memorial. Our Past Grand Master, MW Claire Tusch, has been working diligently to work out the details of this trip. I think we have a little bit of an in as our Past Grand Master is the President of the Memorial. Let's give him a hand for that. This excursion is scheduled for September 25th of this year. As the details become available, we will keep you informed. I know that there were several Brethren who were disappointed last year but we look forward to being able to attend this year. We are diligently working on rescheduling the Oklahoma Native American Degree Team for April of 2022. Maine Day at the Sea Dogs ballpark is a little more challenging as they permit only small pods to attend.

In the last year, several Brethren expressed what I believe to be their frustrations due to the situation we find ourselves via social media. This social media activity required frequent interventions to remind a brother of his errors and aid a reformation. Most often, Brethren recognized the un-masonic nature of what they posted but not always. I don't necessarily fault these Brethren for their frustration and fear of the unknown, but I believe many of these Brethren could have kept their passions within due bounds.

Initially, upon the diagnosis of covid and the subsequent stoppage of all Masonic activity, we as a Fraternity thought that we'd be back at it in a couple of months once this thing is over. What a surprise we got.

Let me, however, shine some light on the perceived perpetual gloom and doom of the last year. Many of the Lodges in this jurisdiction have been creative and took an out-of-the-box approach to their thinking. Some Lodges have shown remarkable ingenuity and continued to prosper and bring relief to the communities in which they reside. Many of our Lodges began providing drive-by meals for the community, which seemed to be most popular. The Lodges that did this have been able to use the minimal funds they raised and the matching grants to assist their communities and work the programs available to them through the Maine Masonic Charitable Foundation. I am incredibly proud of the Brethren in this jurisdiction and commend them for their perseverance in these unprecedented times. While it may seem as though not much has happened in 12 months, I assure you the Grand Lodge of Maine has been very busy. My time over the last year has been occupied with what I consider the most critical task of protecting our Brethren and this jurisdiction. To ensure that once we get out of our current situation, we may continue to prosper as a Fraternity of men who will continue to labor using the tools of Freemasonry.

Charitable Foundation

Our Charitable Foundation has been very busy.

Fiscal year 2021 (April 1st 2020 to March 31st 2021)

The Foundation's Year in Review

As difficult as 2020 was for all of us, the Foundation was able to accomplish not only the goals established by the Trustees as part of the budget for the fiscal year but also work with many Lodges to respond to local needs in their communities brought on by the pandemic.

The markets did well last year and as a result, the Foundation's investment portfolio grew by over \$7.6 million, and the assets held on behalf of Lodge's and other bodies also grew by over \$1.4 million. Your Foundation is strong and healthy.

Now for the year in review. The Foundation provided 19 Relief Grants totaling almost \$94,000 and 62 Brotherhood Relief Grants totaling almost \$40,000.

It was an understandably slow year for Matching Grants as many lodges tried to work through the limitations brought on by and in response to the pandemic. The Foundation Trustees recognizing the early struggles of families hit hard by the economic impact of the pandemic introduced the COVID-19 Community Betterment matching grant and over 58 Lodges applied for and were granted matching funds under this initiative, totaling just under \$54,000. Below is a summary of the matching grants issued during the fiscal year:

When you combine what the Foundation provided under the matching grants program with what the Lodges provide, the total financial impact of the Matching Grants program is over \$350,000. And this doesn't include the thousands of volunteer hours of support.

The Foundation also launched the MAC program – Masons Assisting Communities initiative in January/February this year. Recognizing that some lodges were not in a position to take advantage of the matching grants program yet also recognizing that in 2020 many small communities needed more help, the Trustees authorized the Foundation to issue an additional 100 grants totaling \$51,000 – no matching dollars were required – so that Lodges could help in their communities where it was needed most.

The MAC program– Masons Assisting Communities initiative is meant to help raise awareness of all that the Foundation, Lodges and Masons do throughout Maine. The Foundation alone provides over \$600,000 of financial assistance annually, when you combine that with what the Lodges do directly in their communities, the total exceeds \$750,000 and this doesn't include the philanthropic giving of Appendant Bodies.

The Foundation also continued its work directly supporting nonprofit organizations that provide statewide assistance. The Foundation contributes to MS research by sponsoring the Bike MS®: Great Maine Getaway; supports suicide prevention training through its work with NAMI Maine and seeks to help end violence against women through its support of Maine Boys to Men, via the statewide rollout of their Modern Masculinity Training Institute, Train-the-Trainer program.

And let's not forget about the "Inclusion Revolution- Unified Champions Club", a program the Foundation helped to launch in partnership with the Alfond Youth and Community Center and Special Olympics Maine. This program continued to grow this year in the 12th District and as was always the plan, is expected to expand to 4 other Districts later this fall. Nothing like some friendly competition between Districts – be looking for some more information if you are in District 6, 17, 19 and/or 23.

In addition to expanding the Unified Champions Club program, helping Maine Boys to Men increase their capacity to reach young men in their formative years, the Foundation also worked with the Rainbow Girls and DeMolay to raise additional funds to support our living Veterans here in Maine. Together, we raised over \$21,000 and beginning on Patriots Day 2021 they began presenting local Veterans organizations like the Travis Mills Foundation and the House in the Woods organization with financial support and providing the Maine Veterans Homes with additional funding to buy much needed items for their residents. In Bangor, the Rainbow Girls raised enough money to provide the residents with a handicapped accessible swing!

We are excited about 2021-2022, there is much that can and should be done. The Trustees of the Foundation recognized that this would be another challenging year for all of us. The Foundation is here to assist Lodges in making a difference in their communities and to that end we have modified the Matching Grants program to make it easier for each Lodge to choose where it can and wants to have the most impact. All Lodges have access to \$7,000 in matching funds and can use up to \$3,000 for any one project or initiative.

I encourage you to reach out to Susan Scacchi, the Executive Director of the Foundation. She is there to help and take your money.

MAC "Masons Assisting Communities" is the brainchild of Susan Scacchi, Director of our Masonic Charitable Foundation, and she has been working tirelessly to increase the awareness and vital presence of Freemasonry in our communities throughout the state.

There is much planned for the upcoming year, but my primary focus is on:

• In-person training for our District Officers and AGLs.

- MW Tom Pulkkinen has agreed to lead the initiative to reintroduce the Dirigo and Mentoring programs to enable the lodge brethren to be more prepared to lead the lodge and prepare our future grand lodge officers.
- To bring about a greater awareness of Freemasonry and create positive changes and assist our communities.
- The reintroduction of Membership seminars, open houses, community awareness, and fellowship nights providing our restrictions continue to relax.

Over the past year, I have had conversations with our Deputy Grand Master regarding the future or our jurisdiction. We often have heard the phrase that our Deputy remembers from his Coast Guard years. "Failing to plan is planning to fail." This is true of the Grand Lodge as well. We realize that more far-reaching goals for the jurisdiction are necessary for continuity between administrations and maintaining a clear path to those goals. If this is true of the Grand Lodge, it is also true for each of our Lodges. Each year in most Lodges, a new Master is installed and often finds himself starting over with no previous plans on the trestle board. I would encourage the Lodges to participate in the Masonic Excellence program and establish long-term goals for the lodge and strategies to achieve these goals.

Many of our Lodges have been struggling to reinvigorate their Brethren. Often there aren't enough Brethren for a quorum. Currently, there are some of our Lodges that are seriously considering giving up their Charters and merging with nearby Lodges. While I don't feel that this is always the best solution, in some instances, it is the best decision for the Lodge and its Brethren. For example, our Grand Treasurer, R.W. Scott Whytock expressed to me that after Governor William King Lodge surrendered their charter, after years of struggling, he felt like "the monkey was lifted off his back." He acknowledges that it was a difficult and emotional decision but one that had to be made. The Lodge Brethren were each issued a demit and were able to join another Lodge of their choice. He then indicated that he now felt like he use to and now remembers what it was about Masonry that he enjoyed and valued so much.

Part of my conversations with our R.W. Deputy Grand Master has focused on the previously mentioned struggles of some Lodges. Our Lodges may benefit from mergers or closures, and in the future, the jurisdiction may benefit from redistricting. In some districts we have a disproportionate balance in how many Lodges are in the district. These are a couple of the long-term considerations of the Grand Lodge. Rest assured that only the Lodge can decide to merge or close.

Another concern that we should all take ownership of is Membership.

We have been experiencing a declining membership over the last couple of decades. However, the number of men joining Freemasonry does not equate to the number of men who stay active in their Lodges. Unless we address why men do not return to the Lodge, there is no effort to increase membership that will sustain us. The key to resolving some of our membership woes is the retention of the Brethren we already have. The key to retention, as I see it, is value.

From the moment a man is an accepted candidate, we are responsible for showing and teaching him Freemasonry's value. We expect much from our new Brethren, and they have the right to expect much from us. The new Rookie pin, not to be confused with the Rookie Award, is a new incentive created for us to recognize our new Brethren and greet them and take them by the hand of brotherly love, kindness and affection to guide them as they learn what Freemasonry's value is. The days of assigning a mentor to assist a new Mason are over. We are all responsible for enhancing the new Brother's experience. It's not just about learning the lesson to regurgitate it in the Lodge to advance to the next degree. It is our responsibility to retain our Brethren. If they don't feel wanted or part of the Lodge, they won't be back.

Allow me to share this with you by an unknown author:

"I'm the Guy"

I'm the guy who asked to join your organization. I'm the guy who paid his dues to join. I'm the guy who stood up in front of all of you and promised to be faithful and loyal.

I'm the guy who came to your meetings, and no one paid any attention to me. I tried several times to be friendly to some of the fellows, but they all had their own buddies they talked to and sat next to.

I sat down several times, but no one paid any attention to me. I hoped very much that somebody would have asked me to take part in a fundraising project or something, but no one saw my efforts when I volunteered.

I missed a few meetings after joining because I was sick and couldn't be there. No one asked me at the next meeting where I had been. I guess it didn't matter very much to the others whether I was there or not.

The next meeting, I decided to stay home and watch TV. The following meeting I attended, no one asked me where I was when the last meeting was held.

You might say I'm a good guy, a good family man who holds a responsible job and loves his community and country.

Do you know who else I am? I'm the guy who never came back!

It amuses me when I think back on how the heads of the organization and the members discussed why the organization was losing members.

It amuses me now to think that they spent so much time looking for new members when I was there all the time.

All they needed to do was make me feel needed, wanted, and welcome!

I think that probably rings a pretty loud bell for all of us.

The stressors on young families today may not allow for regular attendance at the lodges, which is all the more reason to keep track of those Brethren. Let them know you care, and you are there to assist. It seems fitting that the tiny blue flower known as the Forget-Me-Not has been associated with our Masonic history. I ask you, Brethren, to forget me not, and in return, I will not forget you.

The past year has seemingly gone by in the blink of an eye, and for obvious reasons, with much less being accomplished than we had hoped. The Craft has endured the many challenges associated with the pandemic, and the stress of lost jobs or the loss of loved ones has taken center stage in the lives of many Brethren in the last year. Once the dust settles, I am convinced that we will return better and stronger than before. But this will only happen by working together as Brethren should. We are destined to make a positive difference in ourselves, our Lodges, and our communities. We have the tools and the knowledge of how to use them to make repairs in the fractures of our society, one Brother, one Lodge, and one community at a time. Brethren, we are not only doing our work. We are doing the work of the Supreme Grand Architect of the Universe through the use of our tenets and lessons. Brethren, I am proud to stand with you to accomplish that work.

The Grand Secretary made the following motion to the Deputy Grand Master:

RW Deputy Grand Master, I move that the Grand Master's address be referred to the Committee on Doings of Grand Lodge Officers and that the reports of the Deputy Grand Master, The Grand Wardens, The Grand Secretary, The Grand Treasurer and The Grand Lecturer be referred to the same committee without reading.

Motion was seconded. Motion carried.

The Grand Master calls for the Report of Masonic Jurisprudence

Report of Masonic Jurisprudence

Report of the Committee On Masonic Jurisprudence Presented by MW David A. Walker, Chairman

In Grand Lodge Bangor, ME May 4, 2021

The duty of the Committee on Masonic Jurisprudence is to review the directives, dispensations and decisions of the Most Worshipful Grand Master, determine if they are in compliance with our Constitution, Standing Regulations and Digest of Decisions and recommend to the Craft at the Annual Communication whether or not they should be ratified.

This has been an extraordinary year for the world in general and, more to our point here, very much for Maine Masonry. The events of the past 14 months, caused as we all know by a world wide virus, have necessitated strong measures by leaders throughout the world. It has been a trial by fire for our Grand Master. He has needed to make some decisions that would have been unimaginable in the past.

DISPENSATIONS:

The Committee on Masonic Jurisprudence reviewed 15 Dispensations which were approved by the Grand Master. There were 2 for a change of venue for meetings, 1 to confer Degrees in a shortened time period for a member in the Armed Forces on Active Duty, 1 for outdoor degrees and 1 for wearing regalia in parades and other Masonic events and 1 for a change regarding a weather event. There were 9 dispensations related to accommodations due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions.

We also reviewed a number of Edicts issued by our Grand Master, that were also in response to COVID-19.

EDICTS:

The first Edict, dated May 28, 2020 allows for opening Lodges under the COVID-19 restrictions listed by the State of Maine. In it the Grand Master allowed for Lodges to reopen, with no degree work and no meals. The meetings were also limited to 2 hours, require wearing masks, limit numbers in the Lodge and keep a 6-foot social distancing. He issued an accompanying Dispensation to allow for business to be conducted with less than a quorum.

The 2nd Edict is dated June 30, 2020. This Edict is a follow-up to that of May 28 but expanding what Lodges could do at meetings. It allowed EA and FC Degrees to be conducted but with physical distancing, with the exception of the SD and the candidate. Most of this Edict covers what would be considered floor work.

The next Edict is dated Jul 31, 2020. This allowed Lodges to resume meals or refreshments with COVID related guidelines.

The next Edict is dated August 16, 2020. It was the Grand Master's response to a Brother in the 6th Masonic District who had attended two Lodge meetings in that District and had subsequently been diagnosed with COVID-19. It closed all Lodges in the 6th District, as well as the Grand Lodge Office.

The next Edict is dated September 3, 2020. This reopened the Lodges in the 6th District after no further outbreaks had occurred, keeping all previous restrictions in place.

The next Edict is dated October 27, 2020. This one allowed for Lodges to begin MM Degrees with specific guidelines. They were to require doing the degrees with very limited contact, only the Master, Candidate and Sr. Deacon. Only a slightly altered short form was allowed. There were also three specific dates when MM Degrees were allowed.

The next Edict is dated November 20, 2020. This edict addressed Lodge Installations and were again aimed at proceeding under the current State mandates for social distancing, wearing masks and limiting numbers. It also described a blanket dispensation to allow Lodges to hold Installations in larger halls to accommodate up to the 50 person maximum allowed by State mandate.

An Edict issued on November 29, 2020 addressed the changing State COVID Mandates. The latest ordered all gatherings to end at 9:00PM. He issued the order that Lodge meetings follow that rule and created a blanket dispensation to allow Lodges to start work at 6:00 PM to allow Lodges to follow this mandate. It also allowed Lodge to conduct MM Degrees until December19.

The Edict issued January 30, 2021, in keeping with an easing of State mandates, did away with the 2 hour meeting limit and 9:00PM curfew. It also allowed the return of the use of Ruffians, Wayfarers and FC for MM Degrees.

An Edict issues on February 24, 2021 allowed travel between districts.

The Grand Master issued an Edict on March 13, 2021 closing four Lodges in the 17th District, Harmony, Saccarappa, Hiram, Deering and Presumpscot due to COVID-19 outbreaks. This was rescinded on March 19th, after the threat had passed.

As you can see, Brethren, the Grand Master has issued many Edicts and Dispensations to address the work of the Craft due to COVID-19. This Committee feels that these steps have been necessitated by the need for the Craft to be protected while following State mandates and still allowing Lodges to do work. We feel that all should be ratified. We caution that the Edict which made changes to the manner MM Degrees were conducted, as well as edicts allowing changes directed towards opening and closing of Lodge meetings in our opinion were necessary for the welfare of the Craft. We also feel strongly that this should not be construed as anything a Grand Master should ever consider or be allowed to issue under anything but the gravest of calamities, such as what we have been experiencing for over one year.

We recommend the ratification of the Grand Master's Edicts and Dispensations and thank him for his vigilance during a very trying year.

The Committee on Masonic Jurisprudence moves the acceptance of this Report and the adoption of the recommendations contained therein.

Report of the Committee on Amendments to the Constitution

Presented by MW A. James Ross, Chairman

Proposed Amendments to the Constitution

#1 Second Reading and Vote (first presented in 2019)

Proposed by RW David Walton

Section 111 now reads: One lodge cannot confer a degree at the request of another lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction, unless the requesting lodge waives jurisdiction, and the other lodge accepts the candidate in the usual manner and for its usual fee.

As proposed, SEC. 111.2 would be added: This provision may be waived, by dispensation from the Grand Master, in cases of special need. When the dispensation is granted, the Master and at least two other officers of the requesting lodge must be present and participate in the degree.

RW Walton explains that this proposal is not meant to have visitors do all the work for a Lodge but to assist a Lodge in order to give a candidate the best and most meaningful degree possible.

#2 First Reading

Proposed by RW Daniel Bartlett

Section 75.4 now reads: Immediately after the installation of the officers of a lodge, the Secretary shall return Official Forms 25 and 25a to the Grand Secretary so that the records of all officers may be updated, and the lodge's statistical data collated for publication in the Grand Lodge Proceedings.

As amended, it would read: Immediately after the installation of the officers of a lodge, the Secretary shall return Official Forms 25 (or transmit an electronic Certificate of Election using the current Grand Lodge membership database system), and 25a to the Grand Secretary, so that the records of all officers may be updated, and the lodge's statistical data collated for publication in the Grand Lodge Proceedings.

MOTION ACCEPTED

#3 First Reading

Proposed by RW Daniel Bartlett

Proposed Section 75.5 would be struck from the Constitution because as we now, and have for many years, share a common computer database between Grand Lodge and the constituent lodges, there is no longer any need to verify member lists. This Section is outdated and no longer applicable.

Section 75.5 currently reads: Each constituent lodge shall submit once in every four years a complete list of its members to the Grand Secretary, on numbered sheets provided by Grand Lodge, before the first day of February 1984, and each four years thereafter. If such a list is not received by the above dates, a fine of ten dollars will be imposed upon that lodge and a fine of one dollar for each day the list is not received following the date of February 1st.

#4 First Reading

Proposed by RW Daniel Bartlett

Section 92.1 currently reads in part: The Master of the lodge may require of any Mason desirous of being examined for the purpose of visiting his lodge, the production of a Grand Lodge certificate or diploma, or a current receipt for annual dues bearing the seal of the lodge in which the visitor has membership.

As amended, it would read: The Master of the lodge may require of any Mason desirous of being examined for the purpose of visiting a lodge, the production of a Grand Lodge certificate or diploma, or a current receipt for annual dues from the lodge in which the visitor has membership.

The new hard plastic dues cards do not bear a lodge seal.

#5 First Reading

Proposed by RW Richard Bergeron, Jr

Section 2.1 now reads in part for the title of Grand Marshal under appointed officers: Worshipful – Grand Marshal.

As amended, it would read: Right Worshipful – Grand Marshal and the rank of Right Worshipful shall be retained for life.

MOTION ACCEPTED

#6 First Reading

Proposed by W. Albert W. Greenhalgh

Br. Greenhalgh proposes that **section 2.1** be amended so that all Grand Lodge Officers, elected and appointed, past and present, be given the title of Right Worshipful, except for the Grand Master who retains Most Worshipful.

MOTION DEFEATED

#7 First Reading

Proposed by RW Scott C. Walton

Sec. 19.7 currently reads: (of the Grand Secretary): He shall cause a transcript of the journal of the proceedings of the Grand Lodge to be readied as soon after the annual communication as the same can be done. The Grand Secretary shall provide copies thereof to each of the Grand Lodges of the United States and such other jurisdictions as are recognized by this Grand Lodge, one copy to each Officer and Permanent Member of this Grand Lodge and two copies to each lodge.

As amended Section 19.7 would read: He shall cause a transcript of the journal of the proceedings of the Grand Lodge to be readied as soon after the annual communication as the same can be done. The Grand Secretary shall make available an electronic copy to each of the Grand Lodges of the United States and such other jurisdictions as are recognized by this Grand Lodge, each Officer and Permanent Member of this Grand Lodge and each Lodge. A paper copy may be obtained by request in writing to the Grand Secretary by a deadline he determines with proper notice.

The motion passed to lay the proposal on the table for consideration at the next annual session of Grand Lodge, however it was amended by vote to keep the one printed copy intact. All matters considered, this will be presented for discussion and vote next year.

#8 First Reading

Proposed by MW Richard M. Nadeau

Sec. 46 currently reads: The Grand Lodge has power to try and punish any Mason residing within its jurisdiction - whether a member of one of its lodges or not - for any offence committed by him.

(Add Sec. 46.2) it would read: During unusual circumstances such as pandemics, wars, local, state, and federal mandates - when the craft does not have the opportunity to meet at an annual communication - the Grand Master shall have the authority to render decisions on non-ratified disciplinary actions without the craft's ratification. The Grand Master will report his decisions to the craft at the next annual communication or special assembly.

MOTION ACCEPTED

#9 First Reading

Proposed by MW Richard M. Nadeau

Sec. 53.2 currently reads: The Grand Master may also appoint a Past Master of a lodge to be styled Judge Advocate - to perform such duties as may be delegated to

him by the Grand Master, and who shall receive for his services and for necessary expenses such compensation as the Grand Master shall determine.

As amended, it would read: The Grand Master may also appoint a Past Master of a lodge to be styled Judge Advocate - to perform such duties as may be delegated to him by the Grand Master, and who shall receive for his services and for necessary expenses such compensation as the Grand Master shall determine. When disciplinary action must be preferred against a member of the fraternity by the Grand Master, the Grand Master shall not be entitled to appoint himself as Judge Advocate. Doing so is in direct conflict with fair and due process. It also diminishes the confidence placed in the appointed Judge Advocate and the Commissioners of Trials.

MOTION ACCEPTED

Standing Regulation #30 Reading and Vote

Currently Sec. 30 reads: Resolved: No consumption of alcohol on lodge premises is to take place without a dispensation from the Grand Master on each occasion. No invitations shall be issued or announcements to be made concerning an event where alcoholic beverages are to be consumed until after the Grand Master has signed a dispensation. The Grand Master, acting on the advice of the Grand Lodge Standing Committee on Insurance and of the Grand Lodge liability insurance carrier, will require the following items to be submitted with a request for a dispensation: (a) Where alcohol is to be served by a Lessee, the request for a Dispensation must be accompanied by: i. A copy of the rental agreement. Each lodge is free to develop its own rental agreement, however, every rental agreement shall contain the indemnity language contained in a form lease provided by the Grand Secretary. ii. A copy of the Certificate of General Liability Insurance Coverage of the Lessor or Lessee naming the Grand Lodge of Maine as an additional insured with such limits of coverage as shall be from time to time provided by the Grand Secretary. iii. A copy of the Certificate of Alcohol Liability Insurance Coverage of the Lessor or Lessee naming the Grand Lodge of Maine as an additional insured with such limits of coverage as shall be from time to time provided by the Grand Secretary. (In some cases, an insurance carrier may include "Liquor Liability" or "Alcohol Liability" on its general liability Certificate of Insurance in which case only one Certificate of Insurance will be needed.) (b) Where alcohol is to be consumed at a lodge event, the request for a dispensation must the accompanied by: i. The signed statement of the proposed Grand Lodge Representative. ii. The lodge's Certificate of General Liability Insurance Coverage. iii. A Certificate of Liquor Liability Insurance Coverage. (Again, in some cases an insurance carrier may include both general liability and liquor liability coverage on the same certificate.) (c) A dispensation for a Table Lodge shall not be required at this time but may be required at the discretion of the Grand Master. In any event, the lodge shall submit the signed statement of the proposed Grand Lodge Representative. The Grand Lodge Representative at each Table Lodge is authorized to intervene to assure that only two-ounce glasses are used and to personally intervene to halt dispensation of wine to any person more than the

seven two-ounce toasts and to personally prevent any service of wine to a minor under any circumstances. Evidence of insurance coverage with respect to alcohol liability for Table Lodges is not required by this Standing Regulation but may be required at the discretion of the Grand Master. (d) A dispensation for alcohol at Outdoor Degrees (where alcohol is served within two hours after the degree) shall be required. The request for a dispensation shall be accompanied by the signed statement of the proposed Grand Lodge Representative. The Grand Lodge Representative is authorized to intervene to assure that no alcohol is consumed to excess or is provided to a minor or to a person who appears to him to be intoxicated. Evidence of insurance coverage for outdoor degrees is not required by this Standing Regulation but may be required at the discretion of the Grand Master.

If amended, Sec. 30 would read: To see if Grand Lodge will modify Standing Regulation #30 to allow and govern the serving and consumption of alcohol on Masonic premises and at / after Masonic meetings and events.

30. *Resolved:* Alcohol may be served and consumed on lodge premises and at lodge events held off-premises subject to the following rules, and all applicable provisions of existing insurance policies and the laws and regulations of the State of Maine and local licensing authorities and of the Grand Lodge liability insurance carrier. The following provisions shall govern the serving and consumption of alcohol in or on Masonic property and/ or at Masonic events. The Grand Master may also require prior dispensation for any event where alcohol is served or consumed when he deems such action is warranted.

- (a) No alcohol shall be served or consumed two-hours prior to or during any Masonic meeting except for prescribed ceremonial purposes or as hereinafter allowed.
- (b) The Masonic building association, by whatever name, holding title to the property and the tenant lodge(s) must each by majority vote to authorize the serving and consumption of alcohol on Masonic property and at the events of that lodge and may establish additional governance for the use of alcohol on such property and at such events. Grand Lodge rules and standing regulations shall take precedence, followed by rules established by the building association.)
- (c) The building association, lodge, other Masonic related organizations, and non-Masonic lessees engaged in the serving and consumption of alcoholic beverages must have "host liquor" insurance coverage that is included in the Grand Lodge policy that covers Lodges and participating building associations.
- (d) The Grand Master, acting on the advice of the Grand Lodge Standing Committee on Insurance and of the Grand Lodge liability insurance carrier, will require the following items to govern the serving and consumption of alcohol in or on Masonic property and/or at Masonic events.

(1) Where alcohol is to be served by a Lessee, the Building Association shall obtain:

- i. A rental agreement. Each building association / lodge is free to develop its own rental agreement, however, every rental agreement shall contain the indemnity language contained in a lease form provided by the Grand Secretary.
- ii. A copy of the Certificate of General Liability Insurance Coverage of the Lessor or Lessee naming the Grand Lodge of Maine as an additional insured with such limits of coverage as shall be from time to time provided by the Grand Secretary.
- iii. A copy of the Certificate of Alcohol Liability Insurance Coverage of the Lessor or Lessee naming the Grand Lodge of Maine as an additional insured with such limits of coverage as shall be from time to time provided by the Grand Secretary. (In some cases, an insurance carrier may include "Liquor Liability" or "Alcohol Liability" on its general liability Certificate of Insurance in which case only one Certificate of Insurance will be needed.)
- (2) Where alcohol is to be sold at a building association / lodge event:
 - i. The sale of alcohol in a Masonic facility is not permitted except by a duly licensed and insured vendor.
 - ii. Proof of liquor liability insurance from said vendor must be provided to the Grand Lodge prior to the scheduled event and may be submitted on an annual basis to cover all events occurring during that period at that facility. The Certificate of Liquor Liability Insurance Coverage must name the Grand Lodge as an additional insured. The hosting Lodge or building association is responsible for producing a valid certificate of insurance prior to any event being held.
- (c) A dispensation for a Table Lodge shall not generally be required but may be required at the discretion of the Grand Master. In any event, the lodge shall submit the signed statement of the proposed Grand Lodge Representative. The Grand Lodge Representative at each Table Lodge is authorized to intervene to assure that only two-ounce glasses are used and to personally intervene to halt the dispensation of alcohol to any person of more than the seven two-ounce toasts and to personally prevent any service of alcohol to a minor under any circumstances. The hosting building association or lodge shall designate a Mason to be responsible for monitoring alcohol service and consumption at events governed by this Standing Regulation.

MOTION ACCEPTED

Standing Regulation #31 (new) Reading and Vote

Proposed by MW Richard M. Nadeau Gender Reassignment/Identity Information

1. Scope

This document has been created to establish a policy regarding the issues raised for Freemasonry by gender reassignment, gender identification, and masonic conformity in this Grand Jurisdiction. It is intended to eliminate ambiguity, reinforce current policy, and help guide Lodges in their decision-making when determining the qualifications for membership in Maine's Masonic Jurisdiction. It imposes binding rules, and although it gives some general guidance, it does not constitute legal advice or any attempt to usurp the Lodges absolute right to decide who shall be a member of a lodge if the candidate meets the qualifications set forth by this jurisdiction. This document does not attempt to address all the issues relating to gender which may arise as gender reassignment and gender transition become more prevalent in a changing society. When they do, they will need to be addressed in accordance with Masonic principles of lawfulness, kindness, and tolerance. We are at the crossroads of gender identity and masonic conformity. The lodges should use this information when membership, masonic conformity, and gender issues arise.

2. General

It is essential that any situation involving gender reassignment of a Freemason is treated with compassion and sensitivity and that the individual is supported in his decision to transition. If a Freemason who is a member of a Lodge wishes to change gender and no longer identify as male, it is expected that the Freemason will receive the non-judgmental support of their brethren. The privacy of the individual should be respected, and there will be no requirement to inform the Grand Lodge about this change or intention to change. Although there is no requirement to inform the Grand Lodge of such a change, if a Mason does change gender and or no longer identifies as a man, he no longer meets the qualifications for admission into the fraternity or to remain a member of the fraternity and is not entitled to the rights and privileges of Freemasonry.

3. Applications for Admission

A candidate for admission to Freemasonry in Maine must be a man. Should a person who has undergone gender reassignment and has become a man apply to become a Freemason, then his application must be processed in the same way as for any other male candidate. Any qualified candidate for admission may be proposed for membership of a Lodge in accordance with the provisions in the Rules contained in the Book of Constitutions. No candidate should be subjected to questions about their gender.

4. Continued Membership

A Freemason who, after initiation, ceases to be a man also ceases to be a Freemason. It is expected that Freemasons will act with compassion and sensitivity towards their fellow Freemasons who make such a decision. No Freemason will engage in unwanted conduct relating to another Freemason's sex or perceived gender reassignment or gender transition. Such conduct is un-masonic and constitutes conduct unbecoming a Mason, especially if it has the purpose or effect of violating the dignity of or creating an intimidating, hostile, degrading, humiliating, or offensive environment for the mason.

5. Resignation from the Craft

A Freemason who no longer identifies as being a man is required to resign from the Craft. If a person resigns from the Craft, they and their dependents will no longer be eligible for any of the Masonic charities benefits.

6. Exclusion from a Lodge

A Lodge may vote to exclude any member for sufficient cause. The following grounds would constitute sufficient cause:

a. The fact that a member has legally changed their gender from a male.

b. The fact that a member identifies as not being male.

c. The fact that a member is in the process of transition from male to female.

d. The fact that a member's attire is generally accepted as a woman's clothing.

A Lodge may ask a member to resign based on the above grounds.

A Lodge may not at any time require a member to prove that they are legally a man.

7. Amendment

The law and what are considered best practices in this area are developing rapidly. This information may be amended from time to time and so please ensure that you are referring to the latest version.

Report Of the Commissioners Of Trials COMMISSIONERS OF TRIALS

During the past year Two (2) hearings were requested by Brothers who had been suspended or expelled by the Grand Master of Masons in Maine. Accordingly, any other pending suspensions then these 2 are to be dealt with directly at Grand Lodge.

Bangor, Maine

Case No. 2020-1

Grand Lodge Office, Holden, Maine, 10:00 A.M., December 2,2020, GRAND LODGE OF MAINE, A.F. & A.M. vs. ROBERT HERBERT DOYLE, #M056849. (Petitioner)

On the above date and approximate time, the Commissioners of Trials for the Grand Lodge of Maine, A.F. & A.M. convened and heard oral testimony and viewed submitted documents concerning the Petitioner being suspended by the Grand Master of Masons of Maine for unmasonic conduct in that he was engaging in an adulterous affair with another Brother's wife.

The Commissioners heard testimony offered by the Judge Advocate, the Petitioner, and Masonic brother witnesses, much of which was not available to the Grand Master of Masons of Maine prior. Documentary exhibits were also presented to the Commissioners and entered into the record.

After examining all the testimony and all the documentary evidence presented, the Commissioners of Trials unanimously concluded the following:

- 1. Although alleged, no sexual impropriety was found ,as defined, by the Commissioners. So, no clear evidence of an "adulterous affair", by accepted definition, by the Petitioner with the wife of a fellow Brother was proven, But the Petitioner did have a serious and continued involvement with the wife of another Masonic Brother.
- 2. Even when his fellow Brother's marriage became strained (leading to pending divorce proceeding), and his fellow Brother made it unmistakably clear that he wanted the Petitioner to cease and desist in making regular contact with his wife, the Petitioner persisted in having regular contact and meetings with his fellow Brother's wife.
- 3. The Commissioners decided that this consistent and direct involvement with another Brother's wife, notwithstanding the request to stop, is unmasonic Conduct.

The Commissioners of Trials unanimously recommend that the action of the Grand Master to suspend the Petitioner be upheld. It is also the hope of the Commissioners that after the Petitioner has had an opportunity to reflect on his conduct, he should follow the procedure for restoration of membership as soon as it is available to him. Grand Lodge Office, Holden, Maine, Via Zoom Video Conference,10:00 A.M., January 6,2021, GRAND LODGE OF MAINE, A.F. & A.M. vs. MICHAEL B. LETALIEN, Member # M041276 (Petitioner)

On the above date and approximate time, the Commissioners of Trials for the Grand Lodge of Maine, A.F. & A.M. convened and heard oral testimony and viewed submitted documents concerning the Petitioner being suspended by the Grand Master of Masons of Maine for unmasonic conduct in that he refused to adhere to the safety guidelines put forth by the Grand Master and the State of Maine, a critical lapse in judgement that jeopardized his membership. His actions showing a blatant disregard for the oaths he took as the Master of Asylum Lodge.

The Commissioners heard testimony offered by the Judge Advocate, the Petitioner, and Masonic brother witnesses, that the Grand Master did not have available to him prior to the suspension. Documentary exhibits were also presented to the Commissioners and entered into the record.

After examining all the testimony and all the documentary evidence presented, the Commissioners of Trials unanimously concluded that the charge of unmasonic conduct, as described, against MICHAEL B. LETALIEN, Member # M041276 have been proven.

The Commissioners of Trials unanimously concluded that the Petitioner displayed poor judgement and could have dealt with the circumstances in a better manner.

The Commissioners of Trials also unanimously concluded that the Petitioner, up until this instance of poor judgement leading to misconduct, has been an exemplary Mason and has served his Lodge and the Fraternity well and that he is a needed asset of his Lodge.

By a unanimous vote the Commissioners of Trials recommend that the Suspension from Membership be upheld and upon Brother MICHAEL B. LETALIEN submitting a letter to his Lodge and the Grand Lodge of Maine, A.F.A.M. apologizing for his actions and promising to correct his mistakes, and that upon receipt of such letters, MW Richard M. Nadeau, Grand Master of Masons in Maine, change this Suspension to an Admonishment, and restore MICHAEL B. LETALIEN to his previous status.

Report of the Committee on Finance

FOR THE FISICAL YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 2020 AND BUDGET FOR THE 2021 FISCAL YEAR

To the Most Worshipful Grand Master, Past Grand Masters, Grand Officers, Permanent Members and Brethren All:

The principle functions of the Grand Lodge Committee of Finance are to oversee the expenditures of Grand Lodge funds, cause the financial records of Grand Lodge to be audited annually and prepare the annual budget to be presented at the Annual Communication for approval all per section 35 of the Grand Lodge Constitution.

Concerning the audit for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2020, the report from the audit firm Wipfli, the financial statements referred to present fairly the assets, liabilities of the Grand Lodge of Maine Ancient Free and Accepted Masons and its revenues collected, expenses paid and other changes in net assets on a modified cash basis of accounting. The weekly warrants of the Grand Secretary have been reviewed and found acceptable for payment by the Grand Treasurer.

The net assets for the Grand Lodge for the year ending March 31, 2020 were \$1,760,396, a decrease of \$180,879. This was near the bottom of the financial markets due to Covid 19. As a comparison, as of March 31, 2021, the unaudited total assets are \$2,440,916.

Revenue of the proposed budget is based on 14,800 members and a total revenue estimate of \$303,600. We are proposing a \$1.00 increase to \$16.50 on per capita tax. Assessments of \$2.00 for the Maine Mason and \$1.00 for the George Washington Masonic National Memorial will remain the same. \$51,000 from investments is also proposed from revenue.

Total shared cost with the Maine Masonic Charitable Foundation is budgeted at \$307,973 and the Foundation share of this is \$114,560.

Other Grand Lodge expenses total \$25,400, Grand Lodge Officer's expense \$29,500, 2022 Annual Communication \$25,000, Committee expenditures \$27,300 and total Grand Lodge expenses are proposed at \$300,613.

Report of the Committee on Fraternal Relations

In Grand Lodge, 04 May, 2021, Bangor, Maine.

Most Worshipful Grand Master and Brethren All;

A primary responsibility of this Committee is the vetting of requests from Grand Lodges around the world that wish to be accepted as regular and gain recognition from established regular Grand Lodges as a member of the International Masonic family. The significance of recognition is manifold. Importantly, Masonic communication and visitation is prohibited with a Grand Lodge, and its constituent lodges and members, which is not in amity with the Grand Lodge of the visiting Brother.

Appreciating that many of the Masters, Wardens and Lodge representatives to our Grand Lodge Annual Communication may be attending for the first time, it is important to summarize the process and restate the standards of recognition that are accepted by regular lodges to determine whether a Grand Lodge, and hence, its constituent Lodges, is worthy of consideration for recognition by the Grand Lodge of Maine.

Grand Lodges in North America and beyond, depend upon the determination of the Committee on Information for Recognition, a standing Committee of the Conference of Grand Masters of North America, that a Grand Lodge satisfies the standards of regularity to be considered for recognition. This information is then used for the determination of recognition by each member Grand Jurisdiction.

The standards for regularity and recognition are summarized as follows:

- 1. Legitimacy of origin.
- 2. Exclusive territorial jurisdiction, except by mutual consent and/or treaty.
- 3. Adherence to the Ancient Landmarks specifically:
 - Belief in God, The Grand Architect of the Universe.
 - The Volume of Sacred Law as an indispensable part of the Furniture of a lodge.
 - The prohibition of the discussion, in open lodge, of politics and religion.

Since the last voting Communication of the Grand Lodge of Maine in 2019 this Committee has received and reviewed communications from seven (7) Grand Lodges/Grand Orients requesting mutual recognition with the Grand Lodge of Maine, five of which are:

- The United Grand Lodge of Bulgaria.
- The Grand Orient of Bahia. (One of the 26 States of Brazil.)
- The Centenary Grand Lodge of F&AM of Nuevo Leon. (Mexico)
- The Grand Lodge of the Free and Accepted Masons of Lebanon.
- The Grand Orient of Rio De Janeiro. (Brazil)

The conclusion of the Committee of Information for Recognition is that these five (5) Grand Orients/Grand Lodges are practicing regular Masonry and satisfy the standards for recognition. This Committee agrees with their findings and recommends that we formally recognize and engage in full Masonic amity including the exchange of Grand Representatives.

The Regular Grand Lodge of Italy (RGLI) has requested recognition from the Grand Lodge of Maine. This Grand Lodge is one of four (4) operating in Italy which

includes the co-Freemasonry *Grand Lodge of Italy, The Regular Grand Lodge of Italy and The Grand Orient of Italy.* It does not have exclusive territorial jurisdiction nor does it have a treaty with the preeminent Grand Lodge in Italy, The Grand Orient d'Italia which was formed in 1805, has 24,000 members and is recognized by nearly 200 Grand Lodges around the world and by most Grand Lodges in the United States including the Grand Lodge of Maine. Therefore, we recommend rejection of their request for amity.

The Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Maryland has been in full Masonic amity with the Grand Lodge of Maryland A.F. & A.M. for several years. They requested full and mutual Masonic recognition with the Grand Lodge of Maine in a communication dated 14 July, 2020. Approximately twenty years ago our Grand Lodge voted to automatically extend full recognition to any Prince Hall Grand Lodge that is similarly recognized by our member Grand Lodge in the Conference of Grand Masters of North America of the same Jurisdiction. Hence, though we are now in amity by Standing Regulation, it is well as a body to welcome our Prince Hall Brothers of Maryland.

Your Committee urges caution to all Brethren who are travelling or receiving visitors in your Lodge to carefully identify and confirm the regularity of those Lodges and/or brethren with whom you consider engaging in Masonic communication. The Italian request is a classic example of the confusion that arises from the terminology of an irregular Grand Lodge's name; eg. the Grand Lodge of Italy which has women Masons. The 2020 edition is the final year of publication by Pantagraph Printing of *The List of Lodges Masonic*, aka The Tilers' Book. a resource which we have used for many years to determine the regularity of lodges. The content has been picked up by *Amity* and you can obtain printed copies available online at \$25.00 single copy price. A free smart phone App is available at *Amity*, but you will need your Grand Lodge of Maine membership number. This app collects up to date data from over 300 regular Grand Lodges around the world. It appears that it will be the go to site replacing the *Tiler's Book*. The associated web site *amity.copiri.com.*, is slated in future to provide real-time data of every member. Please address any questions to our Grand Secretary.

Brother Pulkkinen was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in 1989, served as Worshipful Master and Secretary of St. John's Lodge in Newburyport, Massachusetts, as District Deputy Grand Master of the 10th Masonic District in Massachusetts, and was elected Junior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts in 2003. Upon returning to Maine, Brother Pulkkinen served as Master and Secretary of Bay View Lodge in Boothbay, coincidently, also in the 10th district.

In Grand Lodge, he has chaired the Long Range Planning Committee, started the Ambassador Program, and chaired the Finance Committee. Recognizing that new masons benefit from early education and quick immersion into the craft, brother Pulkkinen labored tirelessly to advance the Master Mason Rookie Program. Brother Pulkkinen developed the Dirigo Leadership Program and the Maine Masonic Mentoring Program, both of which he has agreed to reestablish and revive in 2021. He authored the Guide for Lodge and Personal Mentors and the Maine Masonic Mentoring Handbook.

M.W. Pulkkinen is active in the York Rite, the Red Cross of Constantine, Scottish Rite, DeMolay, Kora Shrine, and Maine College of Masonic Societas Rosicruciana. Brother Pulkkinen has earned multiple Grand Lodge Awards for his efforts. He is the recipient of the Masonic Ambassador Award and the Josiah Hayden Drummond Distinguished Service Medal. Supreme Council of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction also awarded M.W. Pulkkinen the thirty-third degree in 2001. His Masonic activities also include service as President of the DeMolay and Pine Tree Youth Foundation, Committee Member of the Maine Masonic Charitable Foundation, Committee Chairman on Insurance, and Librarian of Bay View Lodge #0196.

Additionally, he has authored many articles appearing in The Maine Mason and most recently, at my request, has revised the twenty-year-old text, Freemasonry in Maine, to a second edition. Tom has been a trusted mentor, advisor, counselor, and dear friend to me. I can and have called on him to assist with many Masonic challenges aimed at advancing the craft. I have never met a brother as profoundly invested in Masonry as Brother Pulkkinen is. I would refer to him as a Mason's Mason. He enthusiastically welcomes any opportunity to give of his time craft for the benefit of his brethren. For his service to me, the Grand Lodge of Maine and more significantly, to the craft, it is my distinct honor to present, to MW Brother Thomas Edward Pulkkinen the Joshua Chamberlain Medal for exemplary leadership and service to the craft.

The 2020-2021 Masonic year has been anything but typical. As we have continued to battle a worldwide pandemic that has seen many of our brethren sickened and sadly some who succumbed to this virus, we are closing in on some semblance of "normal" in the coming months after more than a year of various states of closure both fraternally and publicly.

On a national level both the Northeast Conference of Grand Masters, held in July and the North American Conference of Grand Masters held in February were either cancelled or limited to a one day Zoom video conference. We look forward to those conferences occurring in person in the coming year. A group of Grand Lodge Officers from several states of the Northeast Conference met regularly during the past year by Zoom video conferencing and all benefited from sharing of ideas and best practices. Most Worshipful Richard M Nadeau and the Grand Lodge of Maine

The 2020-2021 Masonic year saw many highlights for the office of the Grand Treasurer. As in previous years, the duties of the Grand Treasurer are again split fairly evenly between the duties to the Grand Lodge of Maine and the Maine Masonic Charitable Foundation. The finances for the Foundation owned Holden

Masonic Associates as well as the Maine Masonic College remain a part of the responsibilities of this office.

Grand Lodge Budget: For the Grand Lodge of Maine, we once again saw a continued adherence to a well-crafted budget created by the Grand Lodge Finance Committee and related parties. The Finance Committee receives a monthly financial package with some commentary highlighting items of note for their review. The Finance Committee Chair and/or its members often have questions or points of clarification to ensure that the transactions processed are accurately understood and reflected. Operating adjustments due to the coronavirus outbreak impacted this fiscal year in various ways, but all were dealt with at or below budget. It is worth noting that the asset value of the Grand Lodge is now over \$2.4 million, which is more than double where we were at ten years earlier.

Charitable Foundation Budget: The Foundation saw much disruption in the matching grants given out during this year due to covid. Though many were underutilized, the Executive Director has found ways to assist lodges in getting funds into their communities by repurposing various pools of money that weren't used as expected before covid impacted the state. The popular Brotherhood Relief grant continues to grow as it has been made use of to give up to \$1000 in relief to those in need. Masonic relief has seen roughly the same number of relief applications this year. Investment values climbed out of the reduction in value due to fear around the coronavirus breakout and ended the year very positively. Budgeting for income continues to be done on a 5-year rolling average, so that the Foundation's impact to income due to market movements is hedged well. The Executive Director's success in fund raising has been substantial this year again, with some large donations. Her guidance and professionalism continued to positively impact the operations of the Foundation by educating the Craft on how the Foundation could benefit their lodge and community.

200th Anniversary: Activity here was disrupted heavily, again due to the coronavirus.

Insurance: The insurance program through the Grand Lodge continues to expand. We're seeing more lodges who are finding cheaper and better coverage in this program than their old providers. We're also seeing quality brought to the system by ensuring that buildings are covered properly.

Investments: The 2020 calendar year experienced large changes. The beginning of the year saw a drastic market contraction due to the impacts and fears of the coronavirus across the globe. Recovery soon began and we saw an unprecedented rebound as market values generally moved upward. We were able to make necessary adjustments and saw no intermediate or long-term negative impact from these changes. The Grand Lodge and Charitable Foundation investment funds managed by HM Payson have been handled with the utmost care and skill. Investment committees for both entities have been continually pleased with the investment policies and performance relative to the major markets.

Maine Masonic College and Holden LLC: Prudent financial controls continue to be brought to each entity as they continue under the care of the Grand Treasurer. By incorporating these entities into the same reporting process as the Grand Lodge and Charitable Foundation, they all receive the same approval, warrant and transmittal system, budgeting, and general processing. Each organization continues to remain in a solid financial position.

Audit: Both the Grand Lodge of Maine and the Maine Masonic Charitable Foundation and their associated entities were audited by the accounting firm MacPage located in South Portland. Both organizations received a favorable audit result and highlighted suggestions have been considered by the Grand Treasurer and related Finance Committees. Each organization previously negotiated a three-year commitment between themselves and MacPage to obtain more favorable pricing. A new pricing contract will be reached with the audit company soon to enhance savings for both entities.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Maine:

With my inaugural year completed, I am proud and fortunate to share with you the thoughts of your Grand Secretary, a report of the condition of the Grand Lodge office and some goals of what we hope to accomplish in the coming years.

As most everyone can say, 2020 was a year like no other. I never imagined that my first year in office would be quite like the one we have had. When I declared my candidacy, we were not yet affected by Covid-19 shutdowns, mask mandates or the several other challenges that this worldwide pandemic has created. I was more worried about keeping up the standard of this office and Grand Lodge. As only the 19th Grand Secretary in 200 years, it weighs heavily on me how important this office is and the great men in our fraternity that have held it. I knew I shared their love for this fraternity, however love alone will not make a great operating officer. While we have had some success on processes and efficiencies, I am most proud of the fact that our beloved fraternity survived this pandemic and continued to do what Mason's

do best, better our communities. The tremendous efforts of Masons all over the state was inspiring and makes me proud to be a member of such a great fraternity.

The Grand Lodge office has undergone some big changes in the last year. In early June 2020, our servers were hacked by ransomware. With the help of some very tech-savvy people, we were able to extract our files without paying the ransom. With the approval of the finance committee, we then upgraded our systems, wiring and moved our storage online to the cloud. We also have a hard copy backup of our files we perform monthly so that we will never again be vulnerable to hackers.

We changed our billing systems to be exclusively online and billed through email. We also started accepting online ACH payments for insurance and annual returns. This has helped turn around time for bills to be paid tremendously and improved cash flow with the Grand Lodge. We hope to continue to increase efficiencies using the technology available to us to streamline our business practices.

At the start of my term, we had about 38% of our membership with valid email addresses in our database, Groupable/M2. I have set an ambitious goal of increasing this to 60% within two years. I am happy to report that after one year, we are now at 48%. Accomplishing this goal will greatly increase our ability to distribute information to the craft in a more timely manner and also assist the lodges with their own communications. It will take an effort from every lodge Secretary, but I am confident we can get there.

Due to a severely under budget year and with the approval of the finance committee, we were able to order a larger amount of replacement regalia for Grand Lodge officers. We began documenting conditions of existing regalia and will be better equipped to replace them as they near their end of life. This process will take a few more years to accomplish, but we are well on our way.

Our Annual Communication will be unlike any other this year, for several reasons. Initially we planned to have no more than 50 people in attendance per the Maine CDC guidelines and facilitate a mostly virtual Communication with interactive voting and participation. Part way through our planning process, the state changed the guidelines, allowing 50% capacity which enabled us to allow 1 member from every lodge, permanent members and Grand Lodge officers attend in person. Due to the limited attendance, we still pursued streaming non sensitive parts on our YouTube channel. A huge thank you to the Technology Committee established for this monumental task, Sean Harrington, Dan Guilmette, and Cal Yeaton. The tremendous job they did this year cannot be understated. As we get back to normal, we intend to continue to have a high quality video produced annually for the archives.

The continued successful operation of the Grand Lodge office is thanks to the capable, hardworking, and diligent team we have. My personal heartfelt thanks to

them, Amy Murphy (who was with us until March 2021), Ashley Baillie and April Cruz. They have really shined this year with all the challenges that the pandemic has brought us, often going above and beyond their normal scope of duties. We have been very fortunate with our Administrative Assistants over the years at Grand Lodge and I am so grateful that this trend continues.

Lastly, I would like to give my sincere gratitude to RW Daniel E. Bartlett. Although he gave up the position of Grand Secretary and was elected Deputy Grand Master, he has always been available to me whenever needed. There is so much to learn with this job and sometimes the answers are not always clear or easy, however Dan never hesitated to take my calls, stop by the office, or do whatever was needed. He claims he finally retired, but I must say this is only partially true as the hours he has put in to help us at the office our countless. Without your assistance Brother, the Craft surely would have seen a difference in our services while we got up to speed. The Craft our surely better off because of your continued service Brother, thank you!

We remained committed to help the Lodges succeed in anyway possible and focus on being accessible and providing excellent service. We look forward to returning to a more "normal" year and what the next 200 years of Freemasonry will bring to our great fraternity.

Masonic College

Report from the Masonic College for May 2020 - May 2021

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Maine:

The Maine Masonic College, like most of the Craft, was heavily impacted by the pandemic in 2020-2021, challenging the College to adapt and work through these unusual circumstances.

LEADERSHIP

The beginning of summer 2020 saw MW Mark Rustin step down as Chair of the Board and MW Wayne Hitchcock resign his position on the Board. The College also suffered the loss of our esteemed faculty member Wayne Adams in July, and the eventual passing of former Chair of the Board, MW Mark Rustin in September. Sustaining these losses, while at the same time limited in the ability to conduct normal business, made the College have to regroup and work together on solutions for moving forward.

Having utilized Zoom for virtual meetings in the past, the Board resumed its monthly meeting format, commencing in August. At the August meeting, Acting Chair VW Daniel Gaucher was voted to serve as Chair of the Board, and reappointed Bro. Luke Shorty to serve as Dean of the College. Nominations were opened for Vice Chair and, after a vote, the position was filled by VW Christopher Howard. Since August, the College has continued its monthly virtual meetings, allowing direct communication among Board members and timely addressing of business. These meetings have been divided into voluntary academic business meetings (hosted by the Chair, Vice-Chair and Dean), and quarterly meetings with mandatory attendance for all Board members. Minutes are taken at all meetings and are made available to all Board members, along with an action items list to keep work progressing in between scheduled meetings.

The Board currently consists of Brothers Karl Furtado, Derrick Gittleman, Eric Kuntz, George Macdougall, Walter Macdougall, Donald McDougal and Douglas Taft. At the April 2021 quarterly meeting, the Board voted on and accepted Brother Brian Ellis as its newest member. Subsequently in May 2021, Brother Doug Drown had to step down from the Board due to health reasons. This now leaves one board seat vacant as a result. Regents will discuss candidates to fill that vacancy at an upcoming quarterly meeting. Existing members will be attending a "Professional Development" workshop at the end of June 2021 to continue to improve their leadership towards the College's future.

ADMINISTRATION

During 2020-2021, the College had several administrative changes, beginning with the departure of our long-time and indispensable secretary Theresa Hatch. The position of secretary remained vacant for the remainder of the year, until filled by the

very capable Ashley Baillie. A job summary was developed for the position of secretary citing the various administrative roles including:

- Maintaining a web calendar of upcoming classes, meetings and events
- Recording meeting minutes and noting action items
- Publicizing events across social media, OLP calendar and MORI email
- In the case of a live event, coordinating guest speakers and speaker fees, facilities, catering and equipment
- Coordinating, printing and delivering digital Certificates of Completion and Diploma for the College's various degree programs

ACADEMICS

In spring of 2021, the College turned to revamping its degree program and reaching out to candidates who had been working towards those goals to resume their courses of study. Currently, there are two levels of degree programs. The primary level is titled a "Certificate of Engagment" where in the College shall present to any participant a certificate of engagement after completing, from start to finish, six different Maine Masonic College Courses. The certificate will be signed by the Chair of the Board of Regents and the Dean of the College. The College also provides opportunities for participants who have obtained the certificate of engagement to engage in the second level of the degree program, namely to design a course of study on subject matters of interest to them. This course of study, when completed to the satisfaction of the Board of Regents, shall produce a Diploma dedicated to that subject area. The participant will present their study and findings to the Board of Regents where they will vote on the satisfactory completion of the course of study.

Academic programs had been halted beginning with the lockdown of the State in early spring 2020. Courses previously scheduled for March had to be cancelled. This also included cancellation of our annual Celebration of the Arts and Sciences event in April, originally scheduled to take place at the Black Bear Inn and to focus on the topic of Rhetoric. As the lockdown continued longer than originally anticipated, the College continued to postpone courses and watch developments.

By mid-summer 2020, it was clear that in-person instruction would not be possible for an unspecified amount of time, so members of the Board of Regents familiarized themselves with virtual hosting via Zoom, and outlined a plan to return to active fraternal engagement by virtually hosting the Maine Masonic College Convocation online.

The 2020 Convocation took place virtually on October 24, and was a continuation of the Civility theme that the College has been exploring for the last few years in past Convocations. Speakers included Jessica Harland-Jacobs, an Associate Professor of History at the University of Florida, who teaches courses on modern Britain and the British Empire, Ireland, imperialism, and the Atlantic world. Her first book, Builders of Empire: Freemasonry and British Imperialism, 1717-1927, was published by the University of North Carolina Press in 2007. Also featured was Liam Riordan, a faculty member at UMaine Orono, where he is the Adelaide and Alan Bird Professor

of History. He is a specialist on the American Revolution with a current research emphasis on Loyalists, those who opposed the Patriot movement. He has also done extensive research and community engagement work about the Maine statehood era and its bicentennial commemoration. Both speakers took attendees of the Convocation on a fascinating journey through history to examine the circumstances that led lodges to take root in the north Atlantic colonies and the reasons for Freemasonry's popularity in New England and the Canadian Maritimes during the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries.

Citing the success of this first major virtual event, the Board requested College faculty members to adjust their courses for online presentation to recommence in January of 2021. Since then, the College has made the most of its digital resources, presenting two virtual courses a month on a consistent schedule and extending our reach statewide, and even globally by welcoming Brethren seeking knowledge from over seven countries! Courses have included Critical Thinking, The Secret Geometry of Art, Intro to Geometry, Cardinal Virtues, The Entered Apprentice, The Fellow Craft, and Symbolism. Several students, both international and local, have sent positive feedback and expressed interest in continuing to attend Maine Masonic College classes.

The 2021 Celebration of Arts and Sciences took place on April 3 and was webcast live via Zoom to a broad audience of Brethren from around the globe. The topic of this year's speaker was Sound, and included in-depth research from harmonics to healing with audio. Guest speakers included John R. Thompson, Chair of Physics Dept at UMO and Brian Harris, CEO of MedRythms in Portland, Maine. Professor Thompson laid a broad foundation with his lecture titled, "The Physics of Music." This was followed up by Brian who presented "The Use of Music Therapy in Patients Suffering from Stroke, Parkinson's Disease, and Brain Injuries." The event concluded with a series of presentations from the graduate level students in the UMaine Honors College. It is always interesting to see the broad scope of research which is being done by today's young academics, and the MMC's relationship with UMaine Honors College ensures this remains an integral part of this annual event.

ACADEMIC PARTNERSHIPS

During the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the College has maintained our several external educational partnerships. In 2020, the MMC gave \$500 to the Planetarium at the University of Maine in Orono to support its ongoing educational endeavors. In addition, we donated \$2000 to support National History Day which benefits Middle School and High School students around the state. We even had the unique opportunity to buy the shirts for the state winners to wear at the Nationals in Maryland. Lastly, we gave \$1000 to purchase books for the Honors College at UMaine for their reading program which assists deserving university students.

CONCLUSION

As the College moves forward into this new digital era, we seek to leverage these resources now at our hands, while maintaining those close fraternal bonds with our local Lodges. We do look forward to meeting again face to face, as Brothers seeking

knowledge, however the conditions of this past year forced the College to adapt and develop digital tools for instruction, social media outreach and timely communication. The technology has become a vital tool for virtual conferencing (which has increased our visibility and engagement) and streamlined administration via online document organization and management. These tools, combined with a capable and devoted group of faculty and board members, will continue to make the College more efficient in its operations and more effective as a productive component of Maine Freemasonry.

Report on the Condition of the Fraternity

In Grand Lodge Bangor, Maine May 4, 2021

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Maine:

Let us first commend our Grand Master and the other Grand Lodge officers. both elected and appointed as well as the members of our great Fraternity for their 5erv1ce during these trying times. There was no script for them to follow or precedents to lead their way as they sailed through rough and unchartered waters. "Well done good and faithful servants"!

This past year will always be remembered as the year of the Coronavirus. A year in which Freemasonry struggled, but under adverse conditions were able to keep our Fraternity on a positive path for success.

This committee gathers it's information from the D.D.G.M.'s reports. Unfortunately, only a very few District Deputies filed their reports with the Grand Lodge. Thus, there is a substantial loss of information for this committee to present to you a true report of the Condition of the Fraternity. We thank the District Deputies who took the time to write a report. We realize that all District Deputies were working under less than normal conditions, but this alone should not have stopped them from filing a report to inform the Grand Master as to how masonry was performing in their districts.

This year the District Deputies report was a 17- page report, plus a narrative from each deputy telling us in their own words what they believed the condition of their district is. As this committee only receives one page of the 17 pages that are filled out filled out, without the narrative, we had next to no information. With that being said, we will attempt to give you some idea of the happenings throughout this great state for the past year.

We observed that many of the lodges still took advantage of the money available to them from the Grand Lodge Charitable Foundation and were able to help their communities in many ways. Brethren saw the need to help feed families that may have been struggling due to job losses, to build handicap ramps for some, to stack wood for others and just check on their brethren to make sure they were OK and if they were in need.

Some lodges worked candidates as the rules from the CDC and our Grand Lodge would allow. With the regulations that we were strapped with, the lodges found safe ways to continue to work. Other lodges chose not to meet for safety reasons. We hope that lodges have candidates in waiting and will soon be working to bring them into the fraternity or progress them through the degrees to become a MM and assist the lodge in its endeavor to once again operate as before this pandemic.

Membership decline is still a major problem and on the minds of all lodges and is taking a toll on our fraternity as we struggle through hard times. Many officers of their lodges have served for long periods of time and are getting to the point of "burnout". We must increase the numbers of new brethren in our lodges and with the assistance of their mentors to encourage them to serve the lodge. Give them the opportunity to serve with the members of the lodge and we believe your lodge will reap the benefits and rewards. This decline in membership not only puts an unfair burden on the members of the lodge, but also a decrease in revenue which is becoming a major problem for many lodges. There are many programs to help with membership that are available through the Grand Lodge and many brethren ready to assist. It's really easy ...all you have to do is ask.

We do not want this report to sound like all gloom and doom as that is not the case. Many exciting things are happening with Maine Masonry. The last issue of the Maine Mason showed many examples of successes and that Masonry in Maine is in good hands. Will the future be easy? Probably not! We believe that the brethren know and understand the challenges ahead and that time, patience and perseverance will accomplish all things. Recommendations:

We recommend that the Inspection Report form be rewritten and that we find a simple procedure for the D.D.G.M.'s. Although the duties of the District Deputy are many, we must not ignore the duties that the Grand Master has put upon us. You, my brethren are his personal representatives and should act accordingly. We recommend that each lodge or district hold a Fellowship Night. This is a tried and proven success for attaining new members. Work with the Grand Lodge.

There is help available as well as financial help.

In closing, let us say that we are proud to communicate to you what we believe the Condition of the Fraternity is. We believe it will take much hard work and the working hands of the brethren, but we also know that the brethren of Maine Masonry are up to the task and that when this virus allows us to once again meet in harmony the Maine Masons will again shine throughout our communities. We thank our Grand Master for giving us this task and the opportunity to serve the Craft.

Most Worshipful Grand Master, Permanent members, and Brethren all.

This unprecedented year for all of us was an unprecedented year for the MEALS Committee as well. We did not hold a single in person all hands meeting during the year. We held numerous ZOOM meetings and at one point were holding monthly ZOOM meetings. While ZOOM proved to be an extremely valuable tool we did find its limits.

Our first order of business was to produce a new more comprehensive form one. We received significant feedback on the new form one and a new version to support the coming year is in development.

We held an in person DER training session at the Auburn Masonic Center. With the majority of the Districts in attendance it was probably the largest Grand lodge event held in 2020. Significant Audit Matters

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Organization are described in Note 1 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted, and the application of existing policies was not changed during the year ended March 31, 2021. We noted no transactions entered into by the Organization during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements was:

Management's estimate of the fair values of financial instruments is based on management's evaluation of each type of instrument and the quoted market prices of each type. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used to develop the fair values of each financial instrument in determining that it is reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

Certain financial statement disclosures are particularly sensitive because of their significance to financial statement users. The most sensitive disclosure affecting the financial statements was:





Ancient Craft Masons

Add 4000 years to the Common Era. Thus: 2019 and 4000=6019

Scottish Rite

Add 3760 to the Common Era. Thus 2019 and 3760=5779. After September add another year.

Royal Arch

Add 530 years to the Vulgar Era. Thus 2019 and 530=2549.

Royal and Select Masters

Add 1000 to the Common Era. Thus 2019 and 1000=3019.

Knights Templar

From the Christian Era take 1118. Thus 1118 from 2019=901

Order of High Priesthood

To the Christian Era add 1913, the Year of the Blessing. Thus: 2019 and 1913=3932.

Masonic Calendar

Ancient Craft Masons commence this era with the creation of the world, calling it Anno Lucis (A.D.), "in the year of light."

Scottish Rite, same as Ancient Craft, except the Jewish chronology is used, Anno Mundi (A.M.), "in the year of the world."

Royal Arch Masons date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, **Anno Inventionis (A.I.)**, "in the year of the discovery."

Royal and Select Masters date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, **Anno Depositionis (A. Dep.)**, "in the year of the deposit."

Knights Templar commence their era with the organization of their Order, Anno Ordinid (A.O.), "in the year of the Order."

Order of High Priesthood dates from the year of the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchisedec, **Anno Benefacio (A.B.)**, "in the year of the blessing."
