
He had a great love of gardening, and spent hours working on his property. He enjoyed numerous hobbies, including his woodworking shop, antique automobiles and German shepherds.

His pastimes included hunting, fishing and woodworking



also held pastorates in Princeton and Vassalboro before accepting a call to the Windham Center church in 1891. His pastorate in Windham was at funeral services and marriages out-


