

He also in recent years had extensively engaged in cattle raising and trading. He was the owner of several valuable pieces of real estate in the


two cities.

Maine. He was a member of Maine's Biggest Buck Club. He also enjoyed boating and traveling the country.



CAMDEN - William Sylvanus Brawn, 84, died Monday at Tall Pines Health Care Facility in Belfast Born in Liberty, he was the son of Fred Preston and Elizabeth Caroline Preston Brown Refore his first

birthday, his father died from an accidental gunshot wound, and he lived in foster care through most of his youth, with much of his childhood spent at the Peavey farm in Palermo Mr. Brawn graduated from

Freedom Academy in 1930, from the Maine School of Commerce Auburn, in 1934 and from the University of Maine in 1941. He taught business education at the Maine School of Commerce, and in high schools at Brooks, Islesboro, Norway and

He enlisted in the Army in December 1941, graduated from Officers Candidate School and served two years in the Pacific as an Army Air Corps combat intelligence officer. In 1953, he became manager with his wife's uncle. M. Alton French, and later joined him in 1963 as partner in the French & Brawn Grocery Store. He became sole owner in 1970, and retired in 1977.

Mrs. Bruwn died on Feb. 19, 1989

His civic involvement including heading the board of the First Congregational Church (UCC) here and the Camden Lions Club. He was a 50-year member of Island Masonic Lodge at Islesboro, and many other Masonic organizations, was a former vice president of the Maine Teachers Association and the National Education Association, and a life member of the VFW


