King Jordan, 78, a former Mayor and member of the State Legislature, died early this morning in his home, 26 Monroe Avenue, after a brief illness. Mr. Jordan had been in failing health three years but had been active until two days ago in the foundry which he founded 45 years ago.

He was born here, the son of the late George and Caroline Bixby Jordan and was a descendant of the Rev. Robert Jordan who settled at Spurwink in the first half of the 17th century.

He was long active in City and State Democratic political circles having served in the Legislature in 1923; as mayor in 1905, 1906, 1933, when he defeated the late King F. Graham who was seeking reelection, 1934 and 1935. He was city treasurer from 1911 to 1916, president of the city council in 1914, when he was elected alderman-at-large, and he was elected alderman from Ward Two in 1921.

He was never defeated for public office. He was a member of the Democratic City Committee for several years from Ward Two.

During his term as mayor in 1905 he built the wing on Westbrook High School and during his term in 1935 the present addition to the school was added under PWA supervision. Mr. Jordan was considered one of the most efficient mayors in Westbrook for his constructive programs in road building, school planning and general civic improvement. During the bank holiday in 1933 he was confronted with the unemployment and serious financial problems but he did not raise taxes.

As a youth he studied civil engineering under Stephen Longfellow of Gorham. He attended the public schools here and completed Westbrook High School before the days of graduation exercises. He worked 18 years in the grist mill of George H. Raymond before he purchased the building in 1899 and entered the foundry business.

He was a charter member and past president of the Rotary Club, a charter member of Wawenock Tribe, IORM which disbanded several years ago and united with Pequawket Tribe at Cumberland Mills; a member of Temple Lodge, F&AM and he attended the Westbrook Congregational Church where he served on many of the leading committees.

Mr. Jordan was prominent for his charitable work.

His wife, Mrs. Iva Barker Quimby died in 1934.

He is survived by four sons, George K., William A. and Rufus N. Jordan, all of this city, and Leonard B. Jordan of Brewer and a daughter, Mrs. Paul H. Smith; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren, all of this city.

Funeral services will be held at 2.30 p. m., Tuesday in the Westbrook Congregational Church with interment in Woodlawn Cemetery.

W. Scott Jordan, 87, retired veteran employe of the S. D. Warren Company, died in a hospital in Westbrook this morning. He had been ill only a few days. 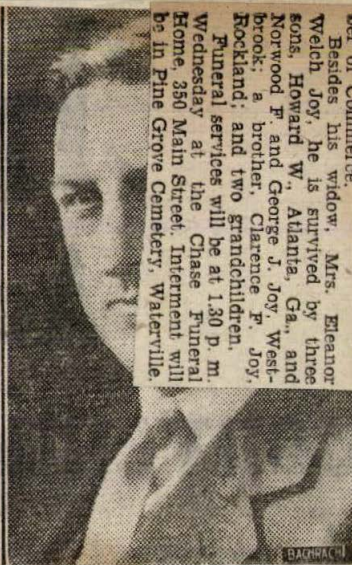

Hale Gray Joy news editor, Ellsworth civic leader

ELLSWORTH - Hale Gray Joy, 74, a longtime newsmen, editor and former president of the Maine Press Association, died Saturday at home after a long illness.

For 33 years, he served as editor, managing editor,

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contributing editor and assistant to the publisher of the Ellsworth American. He retired in January 1982 but continued part-time work at the paper, devoting much of his time to his weekly column "Just Pondering," which he wrote for more than 30 years.

His sister, Leta Estaberg, recalled that his column often focused on humorous matters within the community, as well as celebrated new business openings and other events.

She said his periodic column items on how to hang toilet paper once spawned a church group discussion that lasted at least an hour.

"He wrote about all kinds of things. Sometimes it would be a poem or something humorous that someone had told him," she said.

Mr. Joy's column often credited local new businesses and mourned the loss of those that closed.

His final column appeared last Thursday, when the paper featured a compilation of his work. Among the vignettes and sayings included was a description of leaves "swirling like moths around the lamppost in summer."

He was born in Ellsworth, the son of Charles and Maude Gray Joy, attended Ellsworth schools and graduated from Ellsworth High School in 1928 and from Husson College in Bangor in 1941.

For 18 years, Mr. Joy was associated with his father in the family grocery business in Ellsworth.

He was a past secretary, president and director of the Maine Press Association.

A charter member and past director of the Ellsworth Historical Society, Mr. Joy wrote many historical articles about the community for the Ellsworth American.

Mr. Joy served as secretary and director of the Ellsworth Chamber of Commerce, and a charter member of the Ellsworth Junior Chamber of Commerce, where he also served as secretary, president and director.

In 1992, he received the Ellsworth Chamber of Commerce award for Employee of the Year.

He was a member of Lygonia Masonic Lodge, Acadia Chapter of the Royal Arch Masons and former member of Blauquefort Commandery, Knights Templar, all in Ellsworth. He was a lifetime member of My Sigma Chi Fraternity at Husson College and a past president of that organization.

He was also a founder of the Ellsworth Camera Club and served as its president for four years.

He served on the Ellsworth High School Athletic Council for five years and was a charter member and secretary of the Ellsworth Flyers. Mr. Joy appeared in more than 20 stage productions sponsored by the group.

Mr. Joy served two years on the Hancock County Extension Board and was a member of the Historic Preservation Commission, a trustee of the Col. Black House. He also served on the boards of the Ellsworth American and Husson College Alumni Association.

He also was publicly director for the Hancock County Chapter of the American Red Cross for many years, and publicly director of the Black House.

In 1983, he received the Community Service Award of the BaySide Grange as a non-member who has contributed greatly to civic affairs.

His wife, Eleanor Lobby Joy, died previously.

Survivors include three sons, Richard of Takoma Park, Md., William and Steven of Ellsworth, a daughter, Linda Pudder of Ellsworth, a sister, Mrs. Wendell (Leta) Estaberg of Ellsworth, and two granddaughters, Sarah and Rebecca of Ellsworth.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the First Congregational Church of Ellsworth with the Rev. Ross Wyman officiating. Burial will be at Woodbine Cemetery.

GORHAM — Harold W. Joy, 98, formerly of the Gray Road died Thursday at a Portland hospital.

He was born in Deering, a son of Alvah C. and Alice Reed Joy, and attended Deering schools.

He was a bank manager in several Maine locations, and was also a Maine state bank examiner, retiring in 1950.

After his retirement, he was superintendent of Eastern Cemetery for 25 years.

Herbert L. Joy Sr. retired from Burnham & Morrill

Herbert L. Joy Sr., who baked beans for Burnham & Morrill for more than 20 years, died Saturday at his Portland home after a brief illness.

Mr. Joy, who was 87, lived in his Hawthorne Street residence for about 40 years.

Born in Frammingham, Mass., the son of Frank and Ella

Hodgkins Joy, he moved to New Gloucester where he lived for a number of years with his mother. He later attended Topsham schools.

After high school, Mr. Joy enlisted in the Army and was stationed for three years at Fort Williams in Cape Elizabeth, said his son, Herbert L. Joy Jr. of Portland.

"My father told me that a group (of servicemen) went out to a fort on one of the islands in Casco Bay and buried several cases of rifles in

a hole," his son said. "If they were ever found they'd be in mint condition."

Mr. Joy also told his son that he was a member of the Fort Williams firing squad.

During those years, he served as a lieutenant in Portland's Civil Defense police reserves. After he got out of the Army, Mr. Joy worked part time as a blood worm digger.

"He went up and down the coast digging for worms," his son said.

His full-time job was baking beans at the Burnham & Morrill Co., now a division of Pet Foods, in Portland.

"He made the sauce and baked the beans in a pot," his son said.

Mr. Joy took care of family members during the Depression years of the 1930s.

"He'd bring them into our house and help them in whatever way he could," his son recalled. "He was very generous."

In 1973 he retired from Burnham & Morrill after 23 years of employment.

Mr. Joy then went to work as a security guard for Publicover Security Service Inc. and retired in 1983.

"He loved that job," his son said. "He spent most of his time guarding the old Casco Bank building on Congress Street, but they finally had to let him go. By that time, he was getting pretty old."

Mr. Joy was a 32nd-degree Mason with the Atlantic Lodge in Portland, where he was also past master. One of his duties as a Mason was to learn to speak Latin, his son said.



He was also a former member of the Knights of Pythias.

Playing poker with friends and relatives was his favorite pastime.

"Poker was his life. Every Saturday he'd go down to his friend's house. He loved to play for nickels and dimes right up until the day he died," his son said.

Surviving are his wife of 59 years, Lillian M. Gagne Joy; two sons, Herbert L. Jr. of Portland and Robert L. of Biddeford; two brothers, Lloyd Burns of Windham and Bill Burns of Yarmouth; a sister, Mrs. Edward (Nan) Gilman of Hilton, N.Y.; seven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

A funeral will be held at 1 p.m. Tuesday at Hay & Peabody, 749 Congress St. Burial will follow in Calvary Cemetery, South Portland.
