FAIRFIELD — Roger Austin Nye, 94, of 17 Silver St., died Dec. 25, 1987, at his home.

He was born in Fairfield, March 16, 1893, the son of William and Cora (Chapman) Nye.

He was a 1912 graduate of Lawrence High School and attended Colby College in Waterville.

Mr. Nye was employed by the former L.A. & W. Electric Railway and the Treasury Department of the Augusta State Hospital.

He became associated with the Maine and New Hampshire Theatre Corp. In 1912 he went to Boston to study with vocal teacher Isidore Braggiotti. He also studied in New York and Italy and traveled extensively in the United States appearing in recitals, theater and as church soloist.

While in New York he studied and graduated from the Alviene School of Dramatic Art. Returning to Maine in the 1930s he appeared in recitals and was the Pine Tree Tenor over Augusta radio station WRDO, directed several church choirs and gave private vocal lessons at Bowdoin, Colby and Bates colleges. He maintained studios in both Augusta and Fairfield.

He was a member of the National College Musical Society, the Educational Speech and Theatre Association of Maine, as well as a fellow lieutenant governor of the National Association of Teachers Singing.

He was also a member of Zeta Psi Fraternity, Siloam Masonic Lodge, and the Eastern Star, both of Fairfield.

In 1974 he was presented the "Bulldog Award" by the Lawrence High School Alumni Association.

Surviving are his brother, William J. Nye of Fairfield; and several nieces, nephews and cousins.

A funeral service will be held at 1 p.m. Monday at Lawry Brothers Funeral Home, 107 Main St., Fairfield, where friends may call from 7-9 p.m. today, and 2-4 and 7 to 9 p.m. Sunday.

Capt. Charles C. Oakes

Yarmouth, Dec. 15.—Friends of Capt. Charles Chandler Oakes were grieved to learn of his death which occurred Dec. 4 at his home in Santa Ana, Calif.

Captain Oakes was born in Yarmouth 78 years ago and spent the early part of his life in this town. He came of a line of seafaring men, and at an early age began a colorful career on the seas. He sailed for years at the helms of famous old windjammers and later in control of steamships. He was for years marine superintendent for the Ward Steamship Lines.

In his career as a sea captain he experienced hurricanes, cyclones and typhoons. He aided in the rescue of crews of many wrecked ships and himself perched atop the wreckage of the "S. C. Blanchard" 1,000 miles from land after five days battling the elements before being rescued.

Captain Oakes and his wife, the former Abbie Buxton, who was his partner in many of his sea voyages, settled in Santa Ana about eight years ago, after Captain Oakes had retired from active work.

Captain Oakes was a member for 57 years of the Masonic lodge of Yarmouth and his grandfather and great-grandfather were charter members of the same body.

Besides his widow, he is survived by a daughter, Miss Mary Oakes of

Santa Ana, and a sister, Mrs. Alice Stevens of Portland.

Funeral services were held in Santa Ana in charge of the Masonic lodge there, and after cremation, his ashes will be brought to his old birthplace, Yarmouth, to rest beside those of his forefathers.
