


He was the owner and operator of Randall's Taxi of Bangor for many years and more recently was employed by Penobscot County as a commissioned court officer in district court.

Orren H. Randell, 76, retired motorman of the local street car service, and a resident of Greater Portland nearly 40 years, died suddenly Tues-

day afternoon in his home, 277 Broad-

way, South Portland.

Mr. Randall was born at Columbia, Washington County, Dec. 12, 1863, and received his schooling at Harrington, where he spent his boyhood. Following his marriage there in 1891, he and his wife resided at Millbridge and then at Nashua, N. H., before coming to Portland.

He entered the employ of the Portland Railroad Company in 1907 after a brief period with the Boston & Maine and Maine Central Railroads, and was continuously employed by the electric railway system until he was retired in 1934 by the former Cumberland County Power & Light Company, now the Central Maine

Power Company.

He was a 32nd degree Mason, joining Narraguagus Lodge, No. 88, 54 years ago and was also a member of Portland Commandery, Knights Templar, among other branches of the order, and of the Eastern Star. 




