Army captain, 'ham' radio operator

SOUTH PORTLAND — Louis B. Rollins, 83, a retired Army captain who saw fighting in both World War II and Korea, died Friday at his home on Willard Haven Road.

A much-decorated soldier, Mr. Rollins served in France and Germany during World War II, and fought on

the front lines early in the Korean War. He was a sergeant and lieutenant before retiring as an Army captain in 1954. Among his many medals were a Bronze Star and a Purple Heart.

"When he was in Germany, he and his men took one town" by themselves, said his wife of 57 years, Kathleen R. Wilcox Rollins. "He never would ask his men to go anywhere that he wouldn't go, and he didn't have to look behind him. He knew his men were with him."

Mr. Rollins was in the first wave of soldiers serving in South Korea and helping that country in its fight against North Korea. He served there from January 1948 to January 1949, and returned after the fighting began.

"It didn't take long to get to the front," he told a Press Herald reporter in an Oct. 8, 1950 newspaper account. "That was in the dreary days when United Nations troops held only a small beachhead in the southeast corner after having been pushed south of the 38th parallel by the Red powerhouse," the story said.

In August 1950, while on a reconnaissance patrol, Mr. Rollins was hit by machine gun fire that shattered his right arm. "He had to swim one-handed across the Nakdong River, to get to where his men were," said a daughter, Betty Lou Kilton of Windham, Conn.

Mr. Rollins ended up spending many of his 20 years in the Army at war or overseas. "We were separated at one time for a whole year," his wife said. "We were in Japan with the children when he was stationed there after the Korean War."

Mr. Rollins worked for P.S. Chick and Son, an auto parts company in Portland, as a bookkeeper for many years. From 1967 to 1972 he lived in Caribou and was a civilian bookkeeper at Loring Air Force Base in Limestone.

He attended South Portland First Congregational Church and was a 32nd degree member of the Cornerstone Masonic Lodge in Portland.

An amateur radio operator since 1960, he operated with the call letters K1PXF. He belonged to "ham" radio nets and had conversed with people all over the world. He had a friend aboard an oil tanker, and once reached him by radio while the tanker was passing through the Panama Canal.

He had a room in his house called the "ham shack," his daughter said. "It had all his radios, his licenses and certificates and his collection of postcards other fellows sent from all over the country."

Born in South Berwick, a son of Alice Beals, he attended schools there.

Surviving besides his wife are two daughters, Betty Lou Kilton of Windham, Conn., and Kathleen R. Rollins of South Portland; eight grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

There will be no visiting hours. A graveside military service will be held at 10 a.m. Thursday in the Maine Veteran's Memorial Cemetery, Augusta. Arrangements are by Hobbs Funeral Home.

PORTLAND -- Paul Adams Rollins passed away peacefully on Oct. 2, 2006, at his home in Portland. A lifelong Maine native, Paul was born in Calais on Sept. 9, 1919. He grew up in Bangor attending Bangor High School where he was, to quote the news clippings, a brilliant track star, the team's big ace, a speedy hurdler, pole vaulter and high and broad jumper, and led his team to the county championships.

It was during his boyhood years that he became an accomplished outdoorsman and rose to the highest honor of Eagle Scout (39 badges, he modestly advised). For all of his life he was an avid fisherman and hunter, becoming a registered Maine Guide and participating in many adventures along the St. John and Allagash, as well as flying into various inaccessible lakes and ponds for trips with friends. The family still recalls him sitting at the kitchen table tying his own flies, the brightly colored feathers, threads and hooks set about, with the smell of the glue making them all a little dizzy.

He was a true Maine woodsman with a love and respect of the outdoors. On occasion he shared his observations with one of Maine's long time columnists, Gene Letourneau, and even got his words quoted from time to time... an early sighting of this bird, or the declining population of this or that fish. One of his favorite places was the family summer camp on big Sebago Lake. Paul knew every reef and sweet spot where the big ones could be found. He was also an inveterate rescuer of the occasional stranded boatman and towed more than one poor soul to safety.

At an early age, Paul discovered that he had the gift of dowsing, or using a divining rod to find water. Over the years he dowsed many proven wells. He could even tell you approximately how deep the vein was and how many gallons per minute. He also found he could use his wedding ring on a chain, as a pendulum, to douse maps. These efforts were also proven by the actual digging in the places indicated. Later in life he thought he might try to douse the winning Megabucks numbers, but this effort proved less successful.

His observations of nature and birdlife led him to his avocation of bird carving. His creations grace the mantels and windowsills of homes from here to Jeckyll Island, Ga., where he sold them while winter vacationing with his late wife, Corrine. The skill and humor which he employed in their creation made them an especially popular item with friends and family.

Paul spent 35 years as a toll testman at the New England Telephone Company in Portland. Back then if there was trouble on a line he would find it, send out the linemen and all would be well.

His math and engineering background at the phone company helped him in his amazing ability to build, create or repair just about anything. He was a builder and fine brick mason, (being a Freemason as well), adding rooms to houses, building a garage, and renovating the family's summer camp, including the sea wall and extensive stonework.

A veteran of World War II, Paul did a tour of duty which included France and Germany where his travels took him to a POW internment camp and on to Berlin. He wrote in his autobiography of the occupation and devastation he witnessed there. The war finally ended and he was able to return home to his wife, Corrine and a son, Andrew, whom he had never seen. His small family was living in Redbank at the time, street after street, and row after row of similar houses. Corrine, fearing he would not be able to find them in the dark when he was expected to return, placed a single candle in the window which shined its light on a picture of her and their son. He found them just fine.

Paul is predeceased by his beloved wife, Corrine Rollins who passed away in April 2005 and whom he missed until his dying day. He is survived by the aforementioned son, Andrew Rollins, who lives in Dunnellen, Fla. with his wife Donna; a daughter, Janet Rollins Donovan and her partner, Rick, of Portland; four grandchildren, Skye Donovan, Andrew Rollins Jr. and his wife Michelle, Christine Rollins, and Belinda Bates and her husband Brian; as well as seven lovely great-granddaughters, Arianna, Elizabeth, Marina, Chantal,

Suzanna and Cassandra (twins), and Courtney; and his white cat, Samantha.

His daughter Janet had the good fortune to be able to be her father's companion and assistant with day to day matters for the last couple of years. She encouraged him to venture from the house and even got him to buy a couple of kayaks which they used together at the lake, the last ride being on a fine autumn day not a week ago. He would stop paddling occasionally and just float aimlessly, listening to the wind, feeling the water underneath him and watching the big fluffy clouds he loved so well. His presence will be felt there always by those he loved, and who loved him in return.

A graveside service will be held at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 10, 2006, in Pine Grove Cemetery, on Route 88 in Falmouth. Arrangements are by Jones, Rich & Hutchins Funeral Home, Portland.
