



Henry A. Skillings

Henry A. Skillings, 67, an employee of the city 33 years and retired superintendent of City Hall, died suddenly of heart disease in a Portland hospital late Friday afternoon.

Mr. Skillings, who was known to his many friends and associates as "Bert," was stricken ill in his home, 496 Cottage Road, South Portland, where he had

lived since 1944.

A Portland native, he was born Dec. 22, 1882, the son of George H. and Carrie Phillips Skillings. He attended public schools here and was graduated from Portland High School and Gray's Business College.
